

## **Syllabus**

Instructor: Lynn Job (pronounced with a long "o"), Doctor of Musical Arts

<u>Format</u>: private, individual instruction | <u>Location</u>: usually at student's residence

(minors require a guardian on-site)

Required Materials: (1) Classical Guitar, (2) Music stand, (3) Tuner [A = 440Hz / use pitch E for string VI (lowest string). Tune upward string by string: E (VI), A (V), D (IV), G (III), B (II), E (I)], (4) Foot rest (left foot), (5) Method book(s) and/or sheet music, if/as assigned during the course.

<u>Optional Materials</u>: (1) <u>Metronome</u> (manual wind preferred for beginners/digital for the advanced student), (2) VCR, DVD, & CD players, (3) Computer, (4) Internet access, (5) Denton Public (or NCTC, or UNT, or TWU) Library patron card.


